

DEVON CRICKET LEAGUE REGISTRATION GUIDE FOR CASUAL & LOAN PLAYERS

Casual Player – Playing Regulation 10

There is often the need for teams who are short of players to ask members of the public to play.

This is only permitted in the C divisions and below. These guest player need to be registered as normal and the process is as follows:

- i. Casual players may only be Category 1 players. (Playing Regulation 8(ii)).
- ii. Note the individual's name (needed for the scorecard).
- iii. Complete the registration via devoncl.play-cricket for approval by noon on the Wednesday following the match being played.
- iv. Advise the Registration Officer and appropriate Result Secretary by email that the registration is for a casual player.
- v. Once the registration has been approved update and amend the scorecard on play cricket.

The information required to register the player is; name, date of birth and the address which can be c/o the club.

Loan Player – Playing Regulation 12

In order to enable players who are not required by, or selected to play for, their own club to have a game of cricket, the following process is permitted:

- i. Neighbouring clubs may agree to share their pool of players, when one club or the other is short of players, in order to 'Get the Game On'.
- ii. Only players who normally play in their own club's 2nd XI or lower can be part of this scheme. Once a player plays in a club's 1st XI in the current season, they are then no longer eligible to take part in this scheme.
- iii. The scheme is only permitted in the F East and West divisions and below.
- iv. The club borrowing the player has to apply for the transfer of the player from the loaning via devoncl.play-cricket.
- v. Advise the Registration Officer and appropriate Result Secretary that registration is under the loan player scheme.
- vi. Once the transfer is approved, update and amend the score card on play cricket.
- vii. When the scorecard has been completed to the Result Secretary's satisfaction, the Result Secretary will lock the result scorecard on play cricket.

viii. The Result Secretary will then advise the borrowing club, the loaning club and Registration Officer that the loan period is now complete.

ix. The loaning club is then to transfer the player back to their own member database.
